CONSENT ORDER

This Consent Order is entered into by the Maryland Insurance Commissioner and AETNA HEALTH, INC. ("AHI" or "Respondent") pursuant to §§ 2-108 and 2-204 of the Insurance Article, and § 19-730 of the Health-General Article, Maryland Code Annotated, to resolve the matter before the Maryland Insurance Administration ("Administration").

I. RELEVANT REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

- 1. Each health maintenance organization ("HMO") that uses provider panels for health benefit plans offered in the State must assure that its provider panels meet certain adequacy standards. On July 1 of each year each HMO is required to file a report with the Administration demonstrating the HMO's compliance with those standards.
 - 2. Section 15-112 of the Insurance Article provides, in pertinent part:
 - (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.

(5) (i) "Carrier" means:

* * *

- 3. a health maintenance organization;
- (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, a carrier that uses a provider panel shall:
 - (i) if the carrier is an insurer, nonprofit health service plan, health maintenance organization, or dental plan organization, maintain standards in accordance with regulations adopted by the Commissioner for availability of health care providers to meet the health care needs of enrollees;
- (c) (1) This subsection applies to a carrier that:
 - (i) is an insurer, a nonprofit health service plan, or a health maintenance organization; and
 - (ii) uses a provider panel for a health benefit plan offered by the carrier.
 - (2) (i) On or before July 1, 2018, and annually thereafter, a carrier shall file with the Commissioner for review by the Commissioner an access plan that meets the requirements of subsection (b) of this section and any regulations adopted by the Commissioner under subsections (b) and (d) of this section.
- 3. The regulations referenced in § 15-112(c)(2)(i) of the Insurance Article are set forth in COMAR 31.10.44.
- 4. The network adequacy standards are set forth in COMAR 31.10.44.04 .06 and consist of travel distance standards (COMAR 31.10.44.04), appointment waiting time standards (COMAR 31.10.44.05), and provider-to-enrollee ratio standards (COMAR 31.10.44.06) (collectively, the "Standards").
- 5. The access plan content and filing requirements are set forth in COMAR 31.10.44.03, which provides, in pertinent part:
 - .03 Filing of Access Plan.
 - C. Each annual access plan filed with the Commissioner shall include:

- (1) An executive summary in the form set forth in Regulation .09 of this chapter;
- (2) The information and process required by Insurance Article, §15-112(c)(4), Annotated Code of Maryland, and the methods used by the carrier to comply with the monitoring requirement under §15-112(c)(5);
- (3) Documentation justifying to the Commissioner how the access plan meets each network sufficiency standard set forth in Regulations .04—.06 of this chapter; and
- (4) A list of all changes made to the access plan filed the previous year.
- 6. COMAR 31.10.44.07 allows a carrier to apply for a temporary waiver from compliance with one or more of the Standards provided that certain criteria are met.

II. FINDINGS

- 7. AHI holds a Certificate of Authority to act as a HMO in the State and uses provider panels for health benefit plans offered in the State. As such, it is subject to § 15-112 of the Insurance Article and the network adequacy standards set forth in COMAR 31.10.44.04 .06. In addition, AHI is required to file a network adequacy plan in accordance with COMAR 31.10.44.03.
- 8. On July 1, 2019, AHI submitted a Network Adequacy Plan (the "AHI 2019 Access Plan") to the Administration.
- 9. On July 16, 2019, the Administration reached out to AHI requesting additional information and clarification of the original information provided in the AHI 2019 Access Plan.
 - 10. On July 29, 2019, AHI submitted additional information.

- 11. On January 30, 2020, the Administration sent a letter to AHI requesting additional information and documentation necessary for the Administration to evaluate whether AHI was in compliance with the Standards.
- 12. On March 24, 2020, AHI submitted additional information and documentation. The information included a revised executive summary form and several proprietary and confidential items, including the detailed network analysis methodology AHI used to measure and assess its performance in meeting the network adequacy standards and the process for monitoring and ensuring the sufficiency of the network to meet the health care needs of enrollees. The information also contained proprietary and confidential material describing the criteria used to select providers for participation in the network and a narrative description of outreach efforts to determine the availability of practitioners for recruitment in areas where enrollees are without the desired access in one or more of the urban, suburban, and rural counties.

A. <u>The Access Plan-Travel Distance Standards</u>

- 13. The data submitted by AHI in connection with the AHI 2019 Access Plan failed to demonstrate compliance with the Travel Distance Standards.
- 14. COMAR 31.10.44.04 provides, in pertinent part:
 - .04 Travel Distance Standards
 - A. Sufficiency Standards.
 - (1) Except as stated in §B of this regulation, each provider panel of a carrier shall have within the geographic area served by the carrier's network or networks, sufficient primary care physicians, specialty providers, behavioral health and substance use disorder providers, hospitals, and health care facilities to meet the maximum travel distance standards listed in the chart in §A(5) of this regulation for each type of geographic area. The distances

listed in §A(5) of this regulation shall be measured from the enrollee's place of residence.

(2) When an enrollee elects to utilize a gynecologist, pediatrician, or certified registered nurse practitioner for primary care, a carrier may consider that utilization as a part of its meeting the primary care provider standards listed in §A(5) of this regulation.

A. For each provider panel used by a carrier for a health benefit plan, the carrier shall provide the network sufficiency results for the health benefit plan service area as follows:

- (b) List the total number of certified registered nurse practitioners counted as a primary care provider.
- (c) List the total percentage of primary care providers who are certified registered nurse practitioners.
- 16. The data self-reported by AHI disclosed the following deficiencies based on distance of a provider to an enrollee's address:
 - (a) Primary Care Providers met the required standard for 99.9% of suburban enrollees, leaving 9 enrollees outside of the travel distance standard of ten miles in one zip code, 20625.
 - (b) Pediatric providers met the required standard for 99.5% of urban enrollees, leaving 27 members outside the travel distance standard of five miles in one zip code, 20714. The standard was met for 99.6% of suburban enrollees, leaving 27 members outside the travel distance standard of ten miles in one zip code, 21716.
 - (c) Allergy and immunology providers met the required standard for 99.9% of suburban enrollees, leaving 8 members outside the travel distance standard of thirty miles in one zip code, 21842.
 - (d) Applied behavioral analyst providers met the required standard for 99.9% of urban enrollees, leaving 7 members outside the travel distance standard of fifteen miles in one zip code 21767. The standard was met for 99.7% of suburban enrollees, leaving 104 members outside the travel distance standard of thirty miles. The standard was met for 99.2% of rural enrollees, leaving 215 members outside the travel distance standard of sixty miles.

- (p) Skilled nursing facility providers met the required standard for 99.6% of urban enrollees, leaving 115 members outside the travel distance standard of ten miles in one zip code, 20714.
- (q) Surgical services (outpatient or ambulatory surgical center) facility providers met the required standard for 99.7% of urban enrollees, leaving 115 members outside the travel distance standard of ten miles in one zip code, 20714.
- (r) Inpatient psychiatric facility providers met the required standard for 99% of urban enrollees, leaving 269 members outside the travel distance standard of fifteen miles in two zip codes, 21402 and 21403.
- (s) Other behavioral health/substance abuse facility providers met the required standard for 99.7% of suburban enrollees, leaving 97 members outside the travel distance standard of twenty-five miles in two zip codes, 21842 and 21843.

- 17. AHI submitted an executive summary as a part of the AHI 2019 Access Plan. The executive summary provides that the specific number of registered nurse practitioners counted as primary care is not included in the geo-access data and that their systems are unable to determine the percentage of registered nurse practitioners that practice as primary care.
- 18. The AHI 2019 Access Plan has failed to include in the executive summary, the number of certified registered nurse practitioners counted as a primary care providers and the total percentage of primary care providers who are certified registered nurse practitioners.

B. The Access Plan-Essential Community Providers

- 19. COMAR 31.10.44.04C(1) provides that each provider panel of a carrier, that is not a group model HMO provider panel, shall include at least 30 percent of the available essential community providers in each of the urban, rural, and suburban areas.
- 20. AHI submitted an executive summary form as a part of the AHI 2019 Access Plan. The executive summary form states that 779 essential community providers are participating in the AHI network, which represents 33.92% of the total essential community providers available in the AHI service area. AHI did not provide documentation to establish the percentages of essential community providers that are participating providers in each urban, rural, and suburban area within AHI's service area.
- 21. The data submitted by AHI in connection with the AHI 2019 Access Plan failed to demonstrate that at least 30 percent of the available essential community

providers in each of the urban, rural, and suburban areas are included in the AHI network.

C. The Access Plan-Appointment Waiting Time Standards

- 22. The data submitted by AHI in connection with the AHI 2019 Access Plan failed to demonstrate compliance with Appointment Waiting Time Standards.
- 23. COMAR 31.10.44.05 states, in pertinent part:

.05 Appointment Waiting Time Standards

A. Sufficiency Standards.

- (1) Subject to the exceptions in §B of this regulation, each carrier's provider panel shall meet the waiting time standards listed in §C of this regulation for at least 95 percent of the enrollees covered under health benefit plans that use that provider panel.
- (2) When it is clinically appropriate and an enrollee elects to utilize a telehealth appointment, a carrier may consider that utilization as a part of its meeting the standards listed in §C of this regulation.

- 24. The data self-reported by AHI disclosed the following deficiencies:
 - (a) Urgent care behavioral health/substance use disorder services met the 72-hour standard for 80% of enrollees, representing a deficiency of 15 percentage points.
 - (b) Non-urgent behavioral health/substance use disorder services met the required standard of 10 calendar days for 89% of enrollees, representing a deficiency of 6 percentage points.
- 25. AHI has acknowledged the deficiencies in its self-reported data regarding appointment waiting time standards. AHI advised that the AHI 2019 Access Plan filing measured appointment waiting times for urgent care behavioral health/substance use disorder services against the Aetna urgent care standard of 48 hours, which is more stringent than the state standard of 72 hours. AHI advised that the survey tool used for this measurement did not allow measurement against the 72-hour standard.

III. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

26. The Administration concludes that AHI violated § 15-112 of the Insurance Article and COMAR 31.10.44.03C by submitting an access plan that failed to comply with the required travel distance standards and appointment waiting time standards, by failing to include in the executive summary plan form the required information regarding certified registered nurse practitioners, and by failing to demonstrate that at least 30 percent of the available essential community

providers in each of the urban, rural, and suburban areas are included in the AHI network.

- 27. Section 19-729(a) of the Health-General Article states in pertinent part:
 - (a) A health maintenance organization may not:
 - (1) Violate any provision of this subtitle or any rule or regulation adopted under it[.]
- 28. Section 19-730 of the Health-General Article states in pertinent part:
 - (a) If any person violates any provision of § 19-729 of this subtitle, the Administration may:
 - (1) Issue an administrative order that requires the health maintenance organization to:
 - (i) cease inappropriate conduct or practices by it or any of the personnel employed or associated with it;
 - (2) In addition to suspending or revoking a certificate of authority:
 - (i) impose a penalty of not less than \$100, but not more than \$125,000 for each violation[.]

ORDER

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, it is ORDERED by the Commissioner and consented to by the Respondent:

- A. That, pursuant to § 19-730 of the Health-General Article, based on consideration of COMAR 31.02.04.02, the Administration imposes an administrative penalty on AHI of \$75,000 for the violations of § 15-112 of the Insurance Article and COMAR 31.10.44.03C identified here;
- B. The obligation of AHI to pay the aforesaid administrative penalty is hereby suspended pending the Administration's (i) review of the access plan submitted by AHI

in 2021; (ii) determination as to whether the 2021 access plan substantiates representations made by AHI related to its intent to adjust record keeping methodologies and to improve its compliance with the Standards; and (iii) based on such review and determination, decision on whether the administrative penalty should be paid, reduced, or rescinded.

OTHER PROVISIONS

- C. The executed Order and any administrative penalty shall be sent to the attention of: David Cooney, Associate Commissioner, Life and Health, 200 St. Paul Place, Suite 2700, Baltimore, MD 21202.
- D For the purposes of the Administration and for any subsequent administrative or civil proceedings concerning Respondent, whether related or unrelated to the foregoing paragraphs, and with regard to requests for information about the Respondent made under the Maryland Public Information Act, or properly made by governmental agencies, this Order will be kept and maintained in the regular course of business by the Administration. For the purposes of the business of the Administration, the records and publications of the Administration will reflect this Order.
- E. The parties acknowledge that this Order resolves all matters relating to the factual assertions and agreements contained herein and are to be used solely for the purposes of this proceeding brought by or on behalf of the Administration. Nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver of the Commissioner's right to proceed in an administrative action or civil action for violations not specifically identified in this Order, including, but not limited to, specific consumer complaints received by the Administration, nor shall anything herein be deemed a waiver of the right of the Respondent to contest other proceedings by the Administration. This Order shall not be

construed to resolve or preclude any potential or pending civil, administrative, or criminal action or prosecution by any other person, entity or governmental authority,

including but not limited to the Insurance Fraud Division of the Administration, regarding

any conduct by the Respondent including the conduct that is the subject of this Order.

F. Respondent has had the opportunity to have this Order reviewed by legal

counsel of its choosing, and is aware of the benefits gained and obligations incurred by

the execution of the Order. Respondent waives any and all rights to any hearing or

judicial review of this Order to which it would otherwise be entitled under the Insurance

Article with respect to any of the determinations made or actions ordered by this Order.

G This Order contains the entire agreement between the parties relating to

the administrative actions addressed herein. This Order supersedes any and all earlier

agreements or negotiations, whether oral or written. All time frames set forth in this

Order may be amended or modified only by subsequent written agreement of the

parties.

H. This Order shall be effective upon signing by the Commissioner or his

designee, and is a Final Order of the Commissioner under § 2-204 of the Insurance

Article.

I. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order may subject Respondent to

further legal and/or administrative action.
