CONSENT ORDER

The Maryland Insurance Commissioner (“Commissioner”) enters this Consent Order (“Order”), with the consent of Tanasha Christian Reid (“Respondent”), pursuant to Md. Ann. Code Insurance (“Insurance Article”), §§ 2-108, 2-204, and any other applicable sections, as follows:

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT AND FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On July 17, 2019, the Administration issued an Order imposing an administrative fine for Respondent’s violation of § 27-403 of the Insurance Article (“Initial Order”).
2. Subsequent to the issuance of the order and before the time to request a hearing expired, Respondent admitted to the facts as stated in the Initial Order and agreed to settle the case to avoid litigation.
3. The facts and violations stated in the Initial Order are incorporated herein by reference and admitted to by Respondent.
4. Respondent agrees to this Order to fully and finally resolve all issues stated in the Initial Order.

ORDER

WHEREFORE, for the reasons set forth above, it is this ^{3rd} day of September, 2019,

ORDERED by the Commissioner and consented to by Respondent that:

A. Respondent shall pay a monetary penalty to the Maryland Administration in the amount of (\$1,000.00). The executed Consent Order and first payment of \$250.00 should be mailed to the attention of: Steve Wright, Associate Commissioner, Insurance Fraud Division, 200 Saint Paul Place, Suite 2700, Baltimore, Maryland 21202.

- i. \$250.00 due on September 2, 2019;
- ii. \$250.00 due on October 1, 2019,
- iii. \$250.00 due on November 1, 2019; and
- iv. \$250.00 due on December 2, 2019.

B. Tanasha Christian Reid shall pay restitution to State Farm in the amount of nine hundred dollars (\$900.00) in accordance with the terms of her August 15, 2019, agreement with State Farm.

C. Failure to pay as outlined in paragraph A, above constitutes a default. Notice of Default is hereby waived by Respondent. Respondent agrees to pay the balance within 30 days of default. The unpaid balance will be sent to the Central Collections Unit of the Department of Budget and Management for collection.

D. The executed consent order and each penalty payments shall be sent to the attention of: Maryland Insurance Administration, Steve Wright, Associate Commissioner, Fraud Division, 200 St. Paul Place, Suite 2700, Baltimore, MD 21202 and shall identify the case by number (MIA-2019-07-017) and name (Tanasha Reid).

E. This Order does not preclude any potential or pending action or prosecution by any other person, entity, or governmental authority regarding any conduct by the Respondent, including the conduct that is the subject of this Order.

F. Respondent waives any and all rights to any hearing or judicial review of this Order, the Initial Order, and all matters pertaining to Case No.: MIA-2019-07-017, to which he would otherwise be entitled under the Annotated Code of Maryland or COMAR.

G. Respondent has reviewed this Order and has had the opportunity to have it reviewed by legal counsel of her choice. Respondent is aware of the benefits gained and obligations incurred by execution of the Order. After careful consideration, Respondent executes this Order knowingly and voluntarily.

H. For the purposes of the Administration and for any subsequent administrative or civil proceedings concerning Respondent, whether related or unrelated to the foregoing paragraphs, and with regard to requests for information about Respondent made under the Maryland Public Information Act, or properly made by governmental agencies, this Order will be kept and maintained in the regular course of business by the Administration. For the purposes of the business of the Administration, the records and publications of the Administration will reflect this Order.

I. This Order shall be effective upon signing by the Commissioner or his designee, and is a final order of the Commissioner pursuant to § 2-204 of the Insurance Article.

J. Nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver of the Commissioner's right to proceed in an administrative action or civil actions to enforce the terms of this Order. Additionally, nothing herein shall be deemed a waiver of the Commissioner's right to proceed in an administrative or civil action for violations based on facts not specifically referenced in this Order or in the Initial Order, nor shall anything herein be deemed a waiver of the right of Respondent to contest such proceedings. This Order shall not be construed to resolve or preclude any pending or potential actions that may be brought by third parties.

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K. Failure to comply with the terms of this Order may subject Respondent to further legal and/or administrative action.

L. This Order contains the ENTIRE AGREEMENT between the parties relating to the administrative actions addressed herein.

M. Except as stated in paragraph 3 of this Order, this Order supersedes the Initial Order and any prior agreements or regulations, whether oral or written.

N. No time frames set forth herein may be amended or modified without subsequent written agreement of the parties.
