Filing Requirements For Special Permit Holders

An educational or religious organization, hospital, or community foundation wishing to issue an agreement for annuity payments shall obtain a special permit issued in accordance with Section 16-114 of the Insurance Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, and Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 31.09.07.06. To apply for a special permit to issue charitable gift annuities:

1. Send a cover letter (*there is no formal application form*), along with the materials requested under COMAR 31.09.07.06 to:

In order to maintain the special permit once it has been issued, an organization shall submit the following:

1. Annual report within One Hundred Eighty (180) days after the end of the special permit holder's fiscal year;
2. A statement by a certified public accountant verifying the existence of adequate reserves among the organization's assets. This statement may be incorporated into the annual audit report.
